

There are lots of parties in *A Haunting in Venice*. And the Libanus 1877 is a party itself.

But the Libanus 1877 is definitively in Borth. As well as adverts for various block-buster 'movies' prior to *A Haunting in Venice*'s screening, the Libanus 1877 advertises local Powys and/or Ceredigion steam trains etc. The Railway Inn is just next door, incidentally. When you leave the Libanus 1877, however, the Transport-for-Wales-train will always be cancelled, and you can only hope not to die sheltering by the Dolphin-named flats or get swept down a long sea-adjacent boulevard until a replacement Lloyds Coaches bus, or panic-taxi, takes you home to safety.
